

Elemental Cremation & Burial Aftercare Checklist

Contact Legal Counsel
You may or may not need legal counsel, depending on the estate that is in consideration.
The value or complexity of the estate generally informs whether or not you will need
legal counsel. If you have a family attorney, this is the time to contact them.
Compile List of Accounts to Close
Each person's estate is unique, so creating a checklist of every account or bill can help
tackle this task. Bank accounts, a phone bill, car loans, and mortgages (contacting the
landlord in cases of renting) are some examples of accounts to address quickly.
Follow Up with Social Security
SSA was notified when the death certificate was filed but it's best to check in with them
to make sure there aren't any loose ends. Their phone number is 1-800-772-1213 and
their website is http://www.socialsecurity.gov/ . If applicable, SSA will notify Medicare of
the death.
Submit Life Insurance Claim
If your loved one had a life insurance policy, you can reach out to them to notify the
company that death has occurred and they can walk you through the next steps of their
process. It's important to note that they will most likely require an original certified copy
of the death certificate that lists the cause of death.
Notify Employer
If this hasn't already been handled, you can contact their employer and speak with their
manager or Human Resources Department.

Here is a link from the Red Cross on how to do this for most social media sites. ☐ Posting an Obituary This is optional but families are always welcome to submit an obituary to the funeral director they worked with to post on our Obituaries Page. You can also contact a local newspaper of your choice to post/print an obituary as well. ☐ Consider Beginning to Plan Your Own Arrangements While death and dying are difficult topics to discuss, it can be beneficial to have a plan in place. This can be as simple as letting your loved ones know what your preferences are

or going the extra mile to set up pre-arrangements with a funeral home, death doula, or
